It is a labor of love for many and we show our SISU by being the only lodge who must cook off site and haul our food. During the May Social Hour members and guests enjoyed excellent strawberry shortcake prepared by the men of the Lodge in celebration of Mother's Day. The Astoria Scandinavian Midsummer Festival Court was in attendance. All members of the Court made a presentation to the membership describing their costumes and thanking their Lodges and the Festival for being selected to the Court. All members of the Court received handmade Koski boxes as gifts. In addition, the Senior and Junior Miss Finland received a check from the Astoria Lodge.

President Trudy Enke called the business meeting to order at 7:15 PM.

Membership applications: A membership application was received from Karin Lahti of Lake Oswego. Her application was approved unanimously.

Initiations: Karin Lahti was initiated and welcomed by members. Her grandmother was an Astorian. Karin has been a member of the Finlandia Foundation Columbia-Pacific Chapter for many years.

Communications: The Secretary read a message from the Grand Lodge Secretary Lynn Wirta about the updates to the Constitution. Members of the Constitution Committee have responded to her about their understanding of the updates. Further work will be done at the upcoming Grand Lodge Officers meeting.

Thank you cards were received from the members of the Scandinavian Court thanking the Lodge for the invitation to attend the meeting. A note from Michael Josephson was read, he complimented the Lodge and Dr. Greg Jacob on the excellent Kalevala Lecture that he had attended.

Trustees report: Willie Nyberg reported for the Trustees:

Our contractor Lee Burnard has worked on the basement reinforcements and new post. An additional beam had to be replaced because it was no longer strong enough to support the structure due to insect damage. The replacement added another \$1,618 to the cost of the current basement improvements, totaling \$6,847.21.

Gene Cutlip has checked the heaters in the bathroom and found that there is gas and the sparks work but the solenoids were not working. They need to be replaced. The outside gas line into the building is good and just needed some surface cleaning.

The Vasa Lodge will be charged an additional \$250 for their rental since they are going to need more time and will have their banquet at the Lodge, not in the hotel.

Newsletter Kahden Uutiset: The new Editor Sherry Bjork did a great job on her first issue of the KU. President Trudy Enke suggested that we have 3 - 4 people at the Lodge to assemble, stamp, and label the printed newsletters for mailing, so that one individual does not need to do it alone.

Auxiliary: Peggy Nikkila read the April minutes of the Auxiliary. Plans for Scandinavian Festival Rice Booth were discussed. Shifts for volunteers have been organized. More drivers are needed to take the rice and fruit soup to the Fairgrounds. In the future checks to Scandinavian Princesses are to be mailed in February for them to better benefit from funds. Auxiliary requests that the kitchen electrical systems be refurbished by October. They also request that we present more music and dance.

Lindgren Cabin: Elaine Lindgren has asked volunteers to host at the cabin on summer weekends.

During the June Social Hour members enjoyed many wonderful pies baked by the women of the Lodge to celebrate Father's Day.

Communications: The Secretary read two thank you cards, one from this year's Sr. Miss Norway who apologized for not being able to attend the May meeting. She thanked the Lodge for the invitation to attend. A card was received from our new member Karin Lahti, thanking the Lodge for accepting her as a member, and expressing her willingness to work

towards our goals. Flyers advertising the Astoria Scandinavian Midsummer Festivals events were read. The organizers are looking for groups of members to participate in the Tug of War and Kubb events.

Sick Members and Sunshine: A card was sent to Kurt Koivu who had been ill, and a card of condolence to Carole Lyngstad whose husband passed away.

Trustees report: Willie Nyberg reported for the Trustees:

Members of Trustees had checked the posts in the M&N Store with Lee Burnard. Future reinforcements of the supports in the area on the first floor will be discussed later.

The Lodge will sponsor and hold another dance at Suomi Hall on Sunday, July 16^{th} , 1 - 4 PM. Members of Trustees will visit the Svensen Cemetery on Saturday, July 16^{th} to meet with the group that helps in the maintenance and cleaning of the Cemetery. A decision has not yet been made about surveying the Svensen Cemetery.

Budget Committee has drafted the 2017 – 2018 projected budget based on the 2015 – 2016 budget.

Newsletter Kahden Uutiset: We hope to have the next issue of Kahden Uutiset ready for printing by Monday morning the 26th of June, when volunteer members will get together at Suomi Hall to fold, secure, label and stamp the newsletters.
