

LODGE NEWS.

During the March membership meeting Lodge members celebrated St Urho's Day with a nice potluck lunch of corned beef and many delicious side dishes. St Urho, David Drafall, greeted members and guests.

Membership applications: Membership applications were received from Chris Lynn Taylor, William Herold and Wallace Hummasti. William Herold is Helen Pitkanen's husband and Wallace Hummasti is Arnie Hummasti's cousin. All three applications were approved unanimously.

Communications: The Secretary noted that the newsletter of the Hockinson Lodge was received and she summarized the contents of it.

Committee reports:

Sunshine report: Judy Lampi's parents Marie and Melvin are not doing well, they are now living in Warrenton.

<u>Trustees Report:</u> Willie Nyberg gave the Trustees report. Trustees welcomed new members Carole Lyngstad and Marvin Hautala, and thanked Bernie Bjork, Stan Hendrickson and Karen Reintzell for their past service. Trudy Enke and Kurt Koivu are checking on the building regularly. Needs for building maintenance and upgrades were discussed. At the next meeting Marvin Hautala will give a report on specific needs. Marvin Hautala will replace Bernie Bjork on the Cemetery Committee. Trustees made a recommendation to have Peggy Nikkila fill the Trustee position left vacant by Bernie Bjork's resignation.

<u>Vote on the vacant Trustee position:</u> Peggy Nikkila had been recommended by the Trustees to fill the vacant Trustee position. There were no nominations from the floor. Election of Peggy Nikkila as a Trustee was unanimous.

Auxiliary minutes: Charolette Nyberg read the minutes of the March 5th Auxiliary meeting. Fifteen members were present. The Nordic Market Bazaar on Saturday, February 17th was good. Auxiliary will give the 2018 Scandinavian Festival \$150 raffle gift. Those who need new food handlers permits can get it at Suomi Hall, if 4 – 5 members will participate, the Health Department will come to conduct the tests. Peggy Nikkila will get further information about the FinnAm Folk Festival in Naselle. Scandinavian Festival Association will have a booth there with information about the new Scandinavian Heritage Park in Astoria. The Scandinavian Court of 2018 will visit Astoria Lodge in May. The court has been invited, and Koski gift boxes have been ordered. Grand Lodge Convention will be held at Suomi Hall on August 24 – 26, 2018. Coffee will be served on Friday, coffee and lunch on Saturday. Saturday Dinner will be catered.

<u>Scholarships:</u> Mary Cornell is in charge of the Grand Lodge Scholarships for the Astoria Lodge. She has applications. Contact Mary if you know someone who may qualify. The application deadline is June 1st.

<u>Scandinavian Festival</u>: The Association is now going ahead with the design of the park. Three architects will be working on the design. Carole asked for ideas on the park, noting that the Swedes want benches, the Danes want snowdrops. Astoria Lodge members suggested Kalevala themed items or a birch tree. The area is very small. A matching grant has been applied for.

<u>Grand Lodge Convention:</u> The Convention will be held in Astoria August 24 – 26, 2018. The following members will be involved: Faith Swanson, Trudy Enke as the Elder, Carole Lyngstad and Helen Pitkanen. Each Lodge sends delegates whose registration fee will be paid.

<u>Lodge Picnic</u>: The picnic will be held on August 19th at noon at the Cullaby Lake County Park south shelter. Reservations have been made and paid for.

<u>Uniontown Association:</u> The Doughboy monument renovations have started. The plan for the Boarding house on Marine drive close to Suomi Hall was discussed. Concerning that there was a meeting at the College on March 26th.

<u>Lindgren Cabin:</u> A committee has been formed to discuss the cabin's future. Finlandia Foundation Columbia Pacific Chapter is in charge. The cabin will be open this summer.

Initiations: During the April meeting four new members were initiated: Chris Lynn Taylor, William Herold and Wallace Hummasti were present, Mike Malmberg was initiated in absentia. Members welcomed all four new members.

Committee reports:

<u>Sunshine report:</u> Shirley Tinner was in the hospital and has been moved to Clatsop Care. Cheryl-West Davies' father passed away. Our member Susanna Bjork-Bell also passed away. The Charter was draped in her memory.

Audit was performed on March 16th. All books are in good order.

<u>Trustees Report:</u> Arnie Hummasti reported for the Trustees: Trustees welcomed new member Peggy Nikkila. Trudy Enke and Kurt Koivu are checking on the building regularly. Needs for building maintenance and upgrades were discussed. We need a cleaning person to work on a regular schedule. The building has several issues that need attention. Trustees will need to use a laser to measure the extent of building sinkage. To be able to do that many areas of the basement need to be cleaned up for access with the laser beam. It was decided to hold a work party to take care of the basement cleaning. Trustees will check into getting a survey done on the Svensen Cemetery.

A folklorist from the University of Turku in Finland will visit the area in July and wishes to interview members for a project on how Finnish-Americans living in the United States are following the old Finnish traditions. Trustees agreed to allow the use of Suomi Hall for his interviews on July 26th.

David Drafall presented a proposal from the Auxiliary to rewire the kitchen. They had received an estimate of \$4,850 for complete rewiring, of which the Auxiliary will pay \$3,000 and they asked the Trustees to provide the remainder of the cost. The plan is to do this in July or August when the kitchen would not be needed for any events. The proposal was approved. Members at the Lodge meeting expressed their willingness to help in the cleaning of the Hall.

<u>Auxiliary minutes:</u> Charolette Nyberg read the minutes of the April 2nd Auxiliary meeting. Nine members were present. Auxiliary will give the 2018 Scandinavian Festival a \$150 raffle gift. Faith was asked to select the gift from FinnWare. A decision was made to use new decorations for the Scan Fest Booth. There was a discussion on food choices or only having Astoria Lodge information at the FinnAm Folk Festival booth in Naselle. Veja Lahti recommended that tea would be served again at the Clatsop Village in December.

<u>Scholarships:</u> Mary Cornell has sent out three applications for the Grand Lodge Scholarships. One completed application has been returned. Contact Mary if you know someone who may qualify. Mary must receive any applications by June 1st. <u>Kahden Uutiset:</u> We do not have an Editor for this month. <u>Scandinavian Festival</u>: Several contests are planned for the Festival, Tug of War, eating contests, Scandinavian spelling bee and a joke competition. Arnie Hummasti will present a historical power point presentation.

<u>Grand Lodge Convention:</u> Plans are all in place. A Shanghaied in Astoria show is planned. All members are invited to the show and the dinner.

<u>Lodge Picnic</u>: The picnic will be held on August 19th at noon at the Cullaby Lake County Park south shelter. Wes and Rosemary Ginther will chair the event. There will be games for kids as well.
