Add Tuesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> to your calendars for the introduction of the 2019 Astoria Scandinavian Midsummer Festival Court at Astoria High School at 7:00 pm. Support our 2019 Senior Miss Finland, Sofia Morrel and our Junior Miss Finland Chloe Jean Stelzig as well as 2019 Miss Scandinavia Kourtney Tischer, our 2018 Miss Finland.

We have a unique opportunity to support Astoria's Scandinavian Heritage Park. The Association has offered us the naming right of the flag pole flying the Finnish Flag. We have accepted this opportunity and now need to raise the \$3500 contribution. We are reaching out to our membership. With our over 200 members; contribute what you can and we will meet this goal. The Astoria Scandinavian Heritage Association is a 501(c) non-profit and you will receive a tax receipt for your donation. # Felicia has shared the recipe of the cake she made for our February meeting.

Kermakakku (Finnish Sour Cream Cake) Cream the eggs, sugar, sour cr

2 eggs, beaten

2 cups sugar

1 pint sour cream

2-3 drops almond flavoring

1/2 ground cardamom

2 3/4 cups flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Cream the eggs, sugar, sour cream, almond and

ground cardamom.

Sift together the flour, salt, soda cinnamon and mix

with egg mixture.

Butter a tube or Bundt pan and sprinkle with

granulated sugar.

Pour batter into pan.

Bake at 350° for 1 hour or until toothpick comes

out clean.

Cool before removing from pan.

Sprinkle turned out cake with powdered sugar.
