Other issues in process are adding railing down the stairway to make it easier for people to go up and down. Trustees are also looking to add a digital lock to the back door. Most of the loading/unloading is done through the back and is easier than bringing supplies up from the front. A new computer was discussed as well. The computer would need to be advanced in order to transfer and store information. The new computer would be used to digitize files. This will help with sharing our records to those who request them. <u>Auxiliary minutes:</u> Charlotte Nyberg reported for the Auxiliary: The Clatsop Retirement Village Celebration will be held on December 7th. Lutefisk Dinner is set for January 11th from 11:30am-2pm, \$20 a plate. The theme this year is Lutefisk, "the other white fish". Cleanup volunteers are still needed. Prune tart bake days will be held Tuesday December 11th and Wednesday December 12th starting at 8am. The goal is to make 100 dozen prune tarts, and 86 have been pre-sold.
